






III Hemispheric Conference on Competitiveness, Innovation, and Logistics: Comprehensive Port Management for Increased Efficiency

AIRPORT

Attendees shall arrive at Tocumen International Airport (PTY) located approximately 35 km (22 miles) from the city center. Ground transportation to the city center via taxi is approximately US \$ 50.

Attendees must clear customs individually at their first point of entry.
