End-of-year message from the Chief of the Secretariat

Dear CIP community,

Just like last year, 2022 has been a challenge for all of us. The COVID-19 pandemic and its negative effects continue to wreak havoc on our health systems and economies, causing changes in consumption patterns and an exponential increase in ocean freight. In addition, the CIP Secretariat once again has been engaged in online capacity building, institutional strengthening activities and project implementation.

In this context, and thanks to the priceless collaboration of the National Port Authority of Peru (APN), the National Port Training Center (CENCAPOR) of the Port of Buenos Aires, the United States Coast Guard, the Bureau of Marine Policy and the National Navigation Center of Uruguay (CENNAVE), as well as L'institute Portuarie d'Enseignement et de Recherche (IPER) of France, the CIP Secretariat has been able to offer 585 scholarships to Caribbean and Latin American port personnel from 27 CIP-OAS Member States, for 30 online certified professional development courses, with a value of US \$ 519,360. In addition, we organized 15 high-level Webinars to support technical capacity building, training more than 1,500 port staff from 26 CIP-OAS Member States on topics such as port security, digitalization and automatization, sustainable port operations, high freight costs, disaster risk management, cruise ports, and gender equality, to name just a few.

Significantly, we wish to express our deep appreciation and gratitude to the Mexican Ministry of the Navy (SEMAR), for their special consideration to commission a Frigate Captain with expertise in port safety and security to the CIP Secretariat for the next two years and who will assist and enhance our work on those topics.

At this year's closing, the CIP Secretariat intends to continue with the training offer for 2023 and, if conditions permit, to organize face-to-face hemispheric events, such as the IV Hemispheric Seminar on Port Legislation and Regulation, scheduled for March in Colonia del Sacramento, Uruguay or the 13th CECIP meeting, to be held in June in Roatán, Honduras, among others. In addition, we intend to increase our offer of courses and webinars in English in order to provide more concrete benefits to our English-speaking Caribbean members.
