May 24



Risk Analysis Matrix for Port Facility Protection Officers

The CIP Secretariat is pleased to announce that the Risk Analysis Matrix for Port Facility Protection Officers is on the CIP Portal under the section of Documents and Resources of the Port Protection and Security Technical Advisory Group (TAG).

The Matrix was created and written by Dr. Noe Cuervo Vásquez from consulting and training company "Dr. Cuervo Consultores". The Secretariat currently has permission for the use and dissemination of the Matrix. The Matrix is a tool created to make quantitative assessments of possible risks presented during port operations. Solutions can be implemented to improve port safety and security based on the evaluations performed with the metrics it gives.


Biden-Harris Administration Opens Applications for \$848 Million in Competitive Grant Funding to Make Roads, Bridges, Transit, Rail, and Ports More Resilient to Climate Change

As part of the President's Investing in America agenda, the Competitive Grant Funding program will invest in projects to make the country's surface transportation system – including highways, public transportation, pedestrian facilities, ports, and intercity passenger rail – more resilient to the worsening impacts of climate change, while reducing long-term costs by minimizing demands for more expensive future maintenance and rebuilding. The program prioritizes innovative and collaborative approaches to risk reduction, including approaches that harness the power of nature to protect against flood, erosion, wave damage, and heat impacts.

By funding projects that improve resilience to natural hazards and climate change impacts, the PROTECT Discretionary Grant Program aims to reduce damage and disruption to the transportation system and improve the safety of the traveling public. The program will improve equity and further environmental justice by addressing the needs of disadvantaged communities that are often the most vulnerable to hazards. Grant applicants at all levels of government, from local governments and Indian Tribes to State DOTs, are encouraged to apply for up to \$848 million in discretionary grant funding, which comes on top of PROTECT formula funding that is already flowing to States.

The Notice of Funding Opportunity for Fiscal Years 2022 and 2023 is available here and will remain open for applicants through August 18, 2023.

The CIP Secretariat is pleased to announce and acknowledge that Mona Swoboda, Program Manager of the Secretariat co-authored a chapter on "Port Automation and Governance" in the newly published book "Smart Ports and Robotic Systems" by the World Maritime University in Malmo, Sweden.

The book provides a comprehensive overview of smart ports and remote technologies in the maritime industry. It demonstrates how modern advances in artificial intelligence and robotics have transformed the shipping industry, and assesses the impact of this technology from a law and governance standpoint. The book covers a range of topics including port autonomous operations systems, cybersecurity, big data analytics, digitalization and blockchain to throw light on the opportunities and benefits of these new technologies in improving security and safety. It also considers the challenges and threats of their application. It concludes by examining the trajectory of national and international regulatory developments. The book will appeal to scholars and students of maritime technology, law and governance, as well as practitioners and policymakers.

Chief Executive Officer, Mr. David Jean-Marie, announced that effective April 9th, 2023, Barbados Port Inc (BPI), will transition the Port of Bridgetown to a full Free Out Port. At the same time, he said BPI will move stevedoring services in-house, for execution by Port labour. Assuming an annual throughput of 100,000 Twenty-Foot Equivalent Unit (TEU) containers at the Port, distributed by imported, exported, transhipped and empty container categories, the net saving to customers in Barbados from the proposed transition is approximately Bds\$7.6 Million

The saving per TEU in the Dry container category will be Bds\$162.27 while that per TEU Refrigerated will be \$168.14 and that for Loaded Exports will be \$63.22 per TEU. Outlining the benefits the new model will bring, Mr. Jean-Marie noted that Shipping Lines will have a more transparent ocean freight, while customers will benefit from a lower Cost Insurance and Freight (CIF) value and consequentially lower imposts.

Additionally, BPI's transition to a full Free Out Port will streamline billing arrangements, where all the cargo-specific costs previously charged through the shipping line as part of the ocean freight, as well as the new consolidated stevedoring services charge and revised Free Alongside Ship (FAS) charge, will now be collected by the Port from local importers/consignees.

The Barbados Chamber of Commerce recognizes that the BPI has no control over Ocean Freight Rates but has committed to working with BPI as they

transition	to	their	new	operating	model.
