


# Implementation of PCS:

The PCS process started in 2016 by our developers ITPartner to ensure that our port complied with IMO FAL convention. Since April 2019, the FAL Convention makes it mandatory for ships and ports to exchange FAL declarations electronically. Port St. Maarten was working toward this, however, in March 2020 after a miscommunication regarding the berthing of a vessel it was agreed upon to have the PCS implementation accelerated to fit the needs of the new situation.








# PCS in Action

## • Example of the Vessel Approval Process:



### Cargo / Cruise / Yachting agent: Show vessel calls in PCS












# VSA, Immigration and Maritime will verify the documents and decide to Approve or Decline










### All stakeholders have approved with full access, ship can dock





# Feedback:

Feedback from all the stakeholders has been positive:

- Coast Guard is able to stay up to date with all expected vessels.
- Customs is able to look into the manifest and determine if they want to perform additional screenings 48 hours prior to the arrival of a vessel.
- Immigration is able to vet all crew and passengers prior to the arrival.
- Agents are able to upload all documents in one central location (Single Window).
- Maritime Inspectorate is grateful that the system allows St. Maarten to be compliant with the IMO FAL Convention.

# **Upkeep of PCS:**

- It has been approximately 3 years since PCS went Live and the system is maintained by our developers and their local support staff.
- Together we have regular meetings and discussions with the stakeholders to address the need of each stakeholder and suggest necessary updates to the system.
