Principles of the MNE Declaration

▶ Principles for governments:

- ▶ Ratify all the Fundamental Conventions and apply to the greatest extent possible, through their national policies, the principles embodied therein.

▶ Principles for enterprises:

- ▶ Obey national laws and respect international standards.

Competitiveness

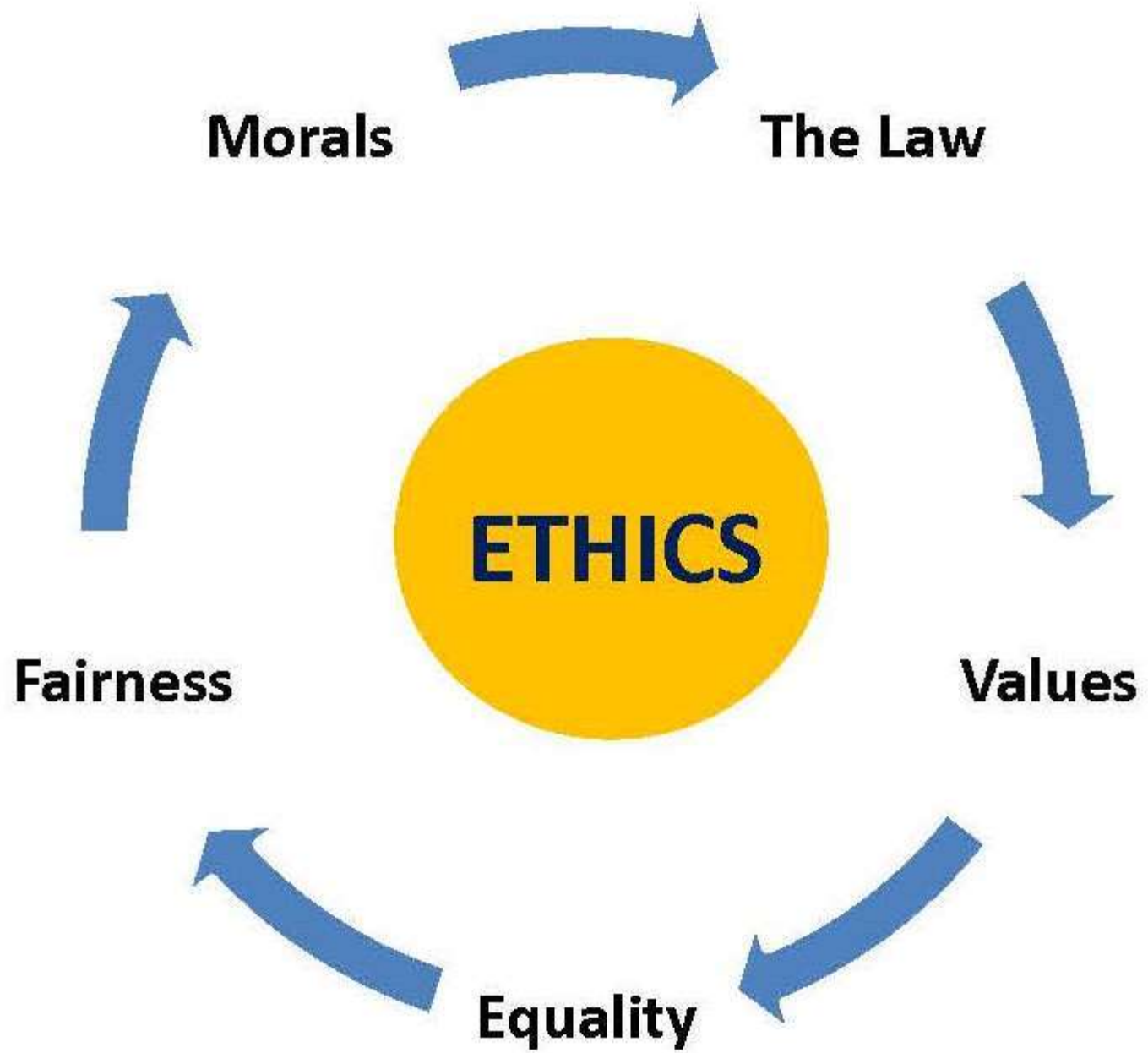
► Definition:

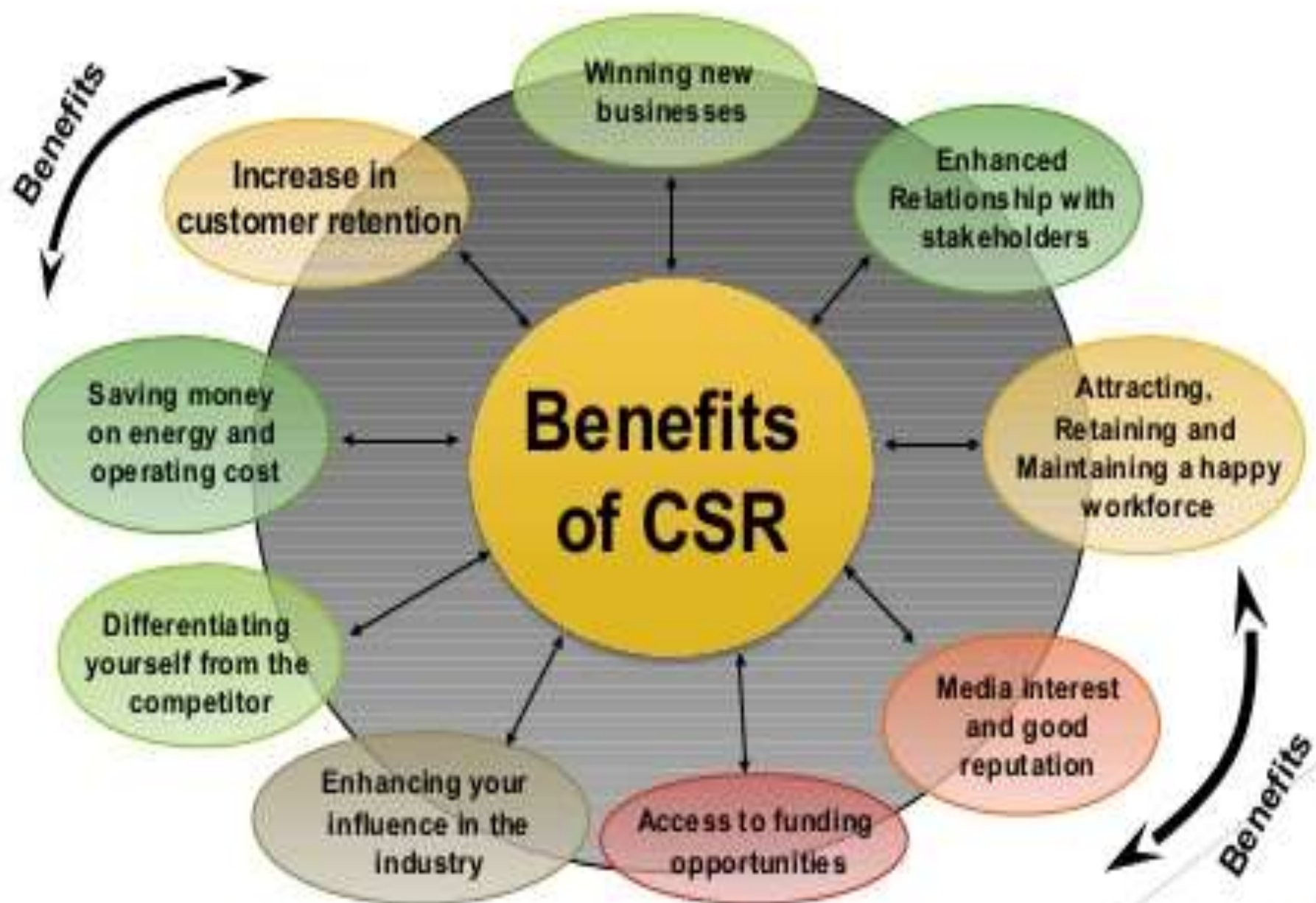
