I. About

The port sector is vital for socio-economic development. In Latin America and the Caribbean, about 95% of exports are mobilized through ports, making them a driver for regional growth. Recognizing the important role of the sector in boosting competitiveness and contributing to the integral development of the Hemisphere, the Secretariat of the Inter-American Committee on Ports (CIP) of the Organization of American States (OAS) promotes the development of competitive, secure, sustainable, and inclusive ports with efficient operations that have a low impact on the environment and bring prosperity to the societies in which they operate.

II. Objective

Launched in 2014, the **Maritime Award of the Americas** is organized by the CIP Secretariat, in collaboration with strategic partners such as the Latin American Society of Marine Oil Terminal Operators and Single-Buoy Mooring (SLOM), the North American Marine Environment Protection Association (NAMEPA), the OAS Department of Sustainable Development (DSD), and the OAS Inter-American Commission of Women (CIM). It recognizes outstanding contributions and successful practices in the port sector of the Hemisphere that demonstrate excellence, innovation, leadership, sustainability, and replicability.

III. Categories

In this **11th edition**, the **Award** will honor winning entries for their positive contributions to the development of the port sector in the Americas. The Award also includes a category that recognizes the **2025 Outstanding Woman in the Maritime and Port Sectors** for her demonstrated dedication, leadership, and empowerment of other women in the sector.

1. Disaster Risk Management

For successful practices that strengthen institutional disaster risk management capabilities and reduce the impact of natural and anthropogenic disasters on port operations.

2. Green Port Operations and Sustainable Management

For successful practices in sustainable port management that help reduce harmful environmental impacts and transform operations in an environmentally friendly manner.

3. Port-City Relationship

For successful practices that mutually promote the economic and cultural prosperity of the port and the city and bring concrete benefits to the community.

4. Outstanding Woman in the Maritime and Port Sectors 2025

For the leadership and dedication of an outstanding woman through significant achievements, as well as professional contributions for the development of the port sector in the Americas. This category is open to women at all public and corporate levels working in ports and/or terminals, National Port Authorities, as well as companies and institutions related to the port sector in any of the CIP-OAS Member States.

IV. Evaluation Criteria

The Jury Committee will consider the following evaluation criteria:

Innovation and Leadership (40 points)

Does the practice/candidate:

- Promote the use of new technologies and tools that go beyond "traditional" approaches?
- Promote the creation of strategic alliances with stakeholders from different entities and/or sectors?
- Promote successful practices and knowledge exchange?
- Promote initiatives that contribute to the community?

Sustainability (30 points)

- Does the practice/candidate promote training and/or capacity building initiatives?
- Does the practice/candidate promote instruments to monitor and evaluate impact?
- Are the accomplishments presented transferable?

Efficiency (30 points)

- Did the practice/candidate accomplish specific objectives?
- Is positive impact verified through measurable indicators?
- Have (human, financial, technical) resources been streamlined to reach the stated objectives?

V. Eligibility

The **2025 Award** is open to both public and private ports, terminals, National Port Authorities, and/or companies and institutions of the port sector from any of the [CIP-OAS Member States](#). Candidates in the **2025 Outstanding Woman in the Maritime and Port Sectors** category must be currently employed in one of the above.

VI. Guidelines

To be considered, each application must include the **application form** (NOTE: the Outstanding Woman category has its own separate form), as well as an **executive PowerPoint presentation** showcasing the application. The presentation may include indicators, images, and/or promotional material (no videos). Documentation shall not exceed 10MB and must be submitted electronically (PDF and/or PowerPoint) in English or Spanish, to Ms. Mona Swoboda, CIP Program Manager, mswoboda@oas.org cc. In addition to the aforementioned guidelines, the applications for the 2025 Outstanding Woman in the Maritime and Port Sectors category must also include:

- **Curriculum Vitae** (max. 2 pages), including a brief description of the current position the candidate holds (must have a minimum of eight years' experience in the maritime and port sectors);
- **Essay** to showcase the candidate's professional contributions, her impact in her institution, and how she empowers women to take leadership (1000 words);
- **Letter** from the candidate's organization/institution/company in support of her nomination (1 page);
- **Additional documents** such as certificates, diplomas, recognitions, etc. relevant to the candidate's nomination;
- **Proof** that the candidate is a citizen or permanent resident of any of the [CIP-OAS Member States](#).

VII. Jury Committee

The Jury Committee includes representatives from:

- Secretariat of the Inter-American Committee on Ports (CIP) of the Organization of American States (OAS);
- Latin American Society of Marine Oil Terminal Operators and Single-Buoy Mooring (SLOM);
- North American Marine Environmental Protection Association (NAMEPA);
- OAS Department of Sustainable Development (DSD-OAS);
- OAS Inter-American Commission of Women (CIM-OAS).

VIII. Evaluation Process

The CIP Secretariat will make a preliminary selection to verify the compliance with the application requirements. The Jury Committee will recognize those entries as winners that, in addition to a high point scale, show measurable impact. Each entry will be evaluated through a point system using the criteria outlined under item IV. In addition, the evaluation will be based on objective and technical benchmarks, impartially and independently verifiable. Once the evaluation process is concluded, the winners will be notified directly. The respective National Port Authority will be copied in this communication. All winning institutions will be recognized and published through official CIP-OAS communications.

IX. The Prize

The winning entries and their institutions will be recognized throughout the Western Hemisphere and published on the CIP-OAS websites, as well as disseminated internationally through various communication channels. Importantly, awardees will be honored during the *VI Hemispheric Conference on Sustainable Port Management and Environmental Protection*, September 23 - 25, in Lima, Peru. Here, the winners, in addition to having the excellent opportunity to network with other industry leaders, will receive:

- ✓ Award Plaque at the Award Ceremony;
- ✓ Participation at no registration cost in the *VI Hemispheric Conference on Sustainable Port Management and Environmental Protection*, September 23 - 25, in Lima, Peru (NOTE: Each winner is responsible for the cost of air fare, accommodation, and per diems);
- ✓ One full year associate membership in the CIP-OAS at no cost (value of up to US \$ 10,000), if applicable, with access to strategic industry information and capacity building.

XI. Special Considerations

- If an institution wishes to apply in more than one category, it must submit separate application forms.
- The CIP Secretariat may answer questions about requirements and the application process.
- The CIP Secretariat will not provide information on the status of applications prior to the official Winners' Announcement.
- Inquiries from applicants that appear to sway or influence the evaluation process will lead to an immediate disqualification.
- A disqualification is not appealable.
